* The vessel is owned by the Dong Won Fisheries Co, which is being sued for £5m in unpaid wages and compensation in a court in New Zealand by around 200 crew members. The Indonesian men bringing the case claim to have been forced to work 20-hour shifts for just £200 a month. They allege that they were physically and verbally abused if they made mistakes, and food was withheld.
